## **Academic Gynecologic Oncologist Physician Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology**

McMaster University is located on the traditional territories of the Haudenosaunee and Mississauga Nations, and within the lands protected by the Dish with One Spoon wampum agreement.

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology in the Faculty of Health Sciences, McMaster University, Hamilton, Ontario is seeking to recruit an academic Gynecologic Oncologist. This full-time position is located at the Juravinski Hospital and Cancer Centre, Hamilton Health Sciences. The current complement of five specialists offers tertiary care in Gynecologic Oncology for the City of Hamilton, LHINs 3 and 4 (Waterloo Wellington, Hamilton Niagara, Haldimand and Brant). The start date for this position will be January 1, 2022.

The successful candidate will have advanced training beyond residency, experience and decision-making skills in providing treatment (including chemotherapy and biologic agents) and surgery (including advanced laparoscopy) for women with gynecologic cancers. The candidate will be able to provide surgical expertise for gynecologic cancers, and women with pre-invasive disease of the gynecologic tract.

The successful candidate will demonstrate a commitment to the education of all levels of learners (fellows, residents and undergraduate students) and will provide leadership and training to future Gynecology surgeons.

The candidate will be expected to fully participate in all of the appropriate departmental and divisional administrative and educational activities. Candidates must have demonstrated capability and interest in clinical, education and/or basic science research and show evidence of a history of research productivity and/or commitment to pursue research that aligns with the departmental divisional academic mission and vision. Alternatively, demonstration of leadership in quality health care delivery (ie., hospital, university or the like) would be of interest.

Applicants should be certified (or eligible for certification) by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and must be licensed (or eligible for licensure) in the Province of Ontario. Academic rank will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Salary is composed of a combination of Alternate Payment Plan salary through the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care as well as stipends provided by the University to support academic and educational activities.

All qualified applicants are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be considered first for this position. To comply with the Government of Canada's reporting requirements, the University is obliged to gather information about applicants' status as either Permanent Residents of Canada or Canadian citizens. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or current citizenship; however all applicants must include one of the following statements: Yes, I am a citizen or permanent resident of Canada and/or No, I am not a citizen or permanent resident of Canada.
